

Michael-Sophia in Nomine Christi

As I have often depicted, there are three stages to the unfolding of the foundations of Anthroposophy—by which I mean the true Anthro-*Sophia* united with *Christ* and the *Archangel Michael*:

- (1) Michaelic—Rudolf Steiner’s life work (1861-1925)
- (2) Christological—Valentin Tomberg’s life work (1900-1973)
- (3) Sophianic—the third teacher’s work,¹ in so far as the Sophia Foundation and others have been able to bring something of this into manifestation in our time (ongoing).

There is, of course, an interweaving between (1), (2) and (3)—the fullness of which is conveyed in the Latin mantric formulation: *Michael-Sophia in nomine Christi*—
“*Michael and Sophia in the name of Christ.*”

Regarding (3): it is noteworthy how in our time female spiritual teachers have emerged in the aforementioned lineage. One striking example is Judith von Halle, born in 1972, who received the stigmata on Good Friday, April 9, in the year 2004.
