The Black Madonna— The Divine Mystery veiled in Blackness

Throughout Europe and Mexico, images of the Black Madonna are enshrined in countless pilgrim churches, in remote monasteries, in tiny chapels and vast cathedrals, in dark crypts and on high altars. She has been visited by millions for hundreds of years. Some claim she is the symbolic remains of a prehistoric worship of the Earth Mother, also tknown as the Queen of Nature, the agent of all fertile transformation in the outside world and in the psyche. Jung called her Isis; in the Catholic tradition, among her many titles, she is referred to as the Sorrowful Mother, Mater Dolorosa, the Madonna of Solitude and Sorrow, who can receive and contain even our most unbearable pain. She personifies the Holy Grail and the Ark of the Covenant in a quest for lost feminine wisdom and the search for soul.

In Austria in the 1950's, artist and Benedictine sister, Meinrad Craighead, wrote of the Black Virgin: "On her face is an expression of utter solitude so intense that the child on her knees or in the embrace of her left arm seems strangely appended. Her eyes are opaque, blank, veiled in the deepest interiority. She sits deeply, a curtained container, a tabernacle, the eternal bloody cave of birth, disintegration, and rebirth."

Known to the Native American Hopi Indians as Crow Mother, she is black as the night sky and the richest soil, dark as the miracle of deeply watered earth in the arid Southwest. She is the mother who fertilizes all life. She is the Keeper of the Balance.

With current thoughts of black holes at the center of our galaxy, science intimates what also lives behing the re-emergence of the wisdom of the Black Madonna: Black is holy. It embraces the mysteries of the night sky.
